








### WHERE ARE WE?




The LBI Ferry from Tuckerton Seaport to Beach Haven



The US Navy established Naval Air Station Lakehurst back in 1921, and it became known as the "Airship Capitol of the World"! Today, "Naval Support Activity Lakehurst" is part of magnificent joint military installation called Joint Base McGuire-Dix-Lakehurst. In the early days of its rich, 100year history, Lakehurst hosted helium-filled dirigibles which traversed the Atlantic, many of them carrying distinguished tourists from Europe to the US in the 1920's and 30's. The most famous

airship, the Hindenburg, was destroyed in flames upon approach to Lakehurst in May of 1936. This story and more vibrant military history can be explored at the Navy Lakehurst Historical Society's Heritage Center located on base in Hangar One.






#### **NATURAL LANDS TRUST:**

The Ocean County Natural Lands Trust Program was established in 1997 as a way to preserve the natural beauty of Ocean County, and protect our watershed. By preserving open space we have established over 25,900 acres of land for public use. Our visitors enjoy many activities from kayaking along the bay, to hiking miles of trail, or hunting on over 13,000 acres.









Ocean County Parks and Recreation offers a wide variety of outdoor activities in 27 parks and conservation areas. With over 4000 acres of preserved and well maintained land you can enjoy hiking, biking, swimming, canoeing, fishing, ball fields, tennis courts, playgrounds and so much more. With parks from Point Pleasant to Tuckerton you're sure to find an adventure near you.

#### Ocean County is home to many challenging golf courses.

Among these are two public courses maintained by the Department of Parks and Recreation. Forge Pond Golf Course was ranked in the top 20 public golf courses to play in NJ by Golf Advisor. Atlantis Golf Course is a much longer course than Forge Pond but to some golf enthusiasts is one of the best layouts in the state of NJ.





Cuisine on the Green is located at Atlantis Golf Course, offering a full service restaurant, bar, and banquet facilities overlooking the green. Cuisine on the Green is also home to the Ocean County Center for Culinary Arts Training, which is part of the Ocean County Vocational - Technical School.
